This will be an important meeting for the neighborhood. Randy Odinet, Project Director for the Memorial Park Conservancy, will make a presentation on the Blossom entrance into the park.

Presentation of the club budget will be made by treasurer, Kathy Bernobich. There will also be the election of new club officers. Tami Hamilton will be running for the position of president, and Tom Tynan for vice president. This will also be an opportunity to meet new members of the club board.

Many of you have seen the demolition of the apartments on the west side of the Westcott traffic circle. Residents from Crestwood and Camp Logan met with the developer in late January, to learn the new building will upscale

apartments. There will be 3 garage levels and 8 residential. Valet parking will be offered on Westcott, with a secondary access from Arnot. No access to Terrace will be sought. There will also be pedestrian landscape buffering between the main structure and the homes on Camellia and Memorial Elementary School.

Finally, residents on Glencove applied for residential parking permits, and were approved by the Parking Management Division of the city. They are now awaiting the drafting of the ordinance and approval by city council.



## **Memorial Park Projects Accelerated**

You have probably all read about the \$70 million donation by the Kinder Foundation last year to the Memorial Park Conservancy (MPC). This donation was followed by several other foundations in smaller amounts which allowed the MPC to accelerate their plans. The pedestrian entrance at Blossom and Crestwood is expected to be finished late this year, and the amazing land bridge over Memorial Drive is now slated for 2022. The lake is also nearing completion. The changes at Memorial Park Golf Course to prepare for the Houston Open has also created some synergies for park projects. We are expecting Randy Odinet, Project Director, from the MPC to make a presentation on the latest plans for the park at our community meeting on April 2.

While having this large and improved park adjacent to our neighborhood no doubt enhances our property values, it does bring concerns about parking and increased traffic, especially for folks on Crestwood and Blossom. Having a PGA tournament next door also requires some planning. We are meeting with the city officials this month to explore ways to mitigate these concerns. We will have a report at the April 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting regarding some options which may be available to address these issues.
